  - (b) Receive a request for voluntary annexation of 41.665 acres located on Hawkinstown Road, Tax Map 324 Parcel 060, and adopt a Resolution instructing the City Clerk to investigate the sufficiency of the request.

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- (d) Authorize a sole source purchase from Badger Meter, Inc. in the amount of \$610,000 for the purchase of 2,000 water meters and cellular endpoints. Expenses for the purchase of the meters will be offset by future tap fee revenues.
  - (e) Adopt a budget Ordinance amendment to the FY2022-2023 budget in the amount of \$23,034 to appropriate Police Department Controlled Substance Tax Funds for the replacement of duty pistols that are past service life.
  - (f) Approve a funding agreement for the allocation of special project funds to the Rowan Economic Development Commission.
  - (g) Adopt a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute and file an application on behalf of the City of Salisbury for grant funding through the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality Division of Water Infrastructure for the development of a Wastewater Treatment Master Plan.
