Tips to Shop Safe

Con artists and scammers are particularly active during the holiday season, both in-person and online. Salisbury Police offers a few tips to stay safe from criminals this holiday season.

In-Person Shopping Tips

- While shopping, stay aware of your surroundings. Keep packages in the trunk or hidden from view.
- Shop during the day or park in a well-lit area at night.
- Keep your purse close to your body and/or don't keep your wallet in your back pocket. Instead, carry your driver's license, cash and/or one credit card in your front pocket.

Online Shopping Tips

- Think before you click: Beware of ads encouraging users to click on links. If you receive an enticing offer, do not click on the link. Instead, go directly to the company's website to verify the
- Use credit cards over debit cards: There are more consumer protections for credit cards if something goes awry. You can also use a third party payment service instead of your credit card.

Toss the Grease!

As cooks gear up for the holiday season, Salisbury-Rowan Utilities has tips for discarding leftover Fats, Oils, and Grease, also known as FOG. When FOG is poured or flushed down the drain it may not travel very far through your pipes. FOG will accumulate and stick to the pipe walls causing future sewer backups in your home, restaurant, or other buildings.

When FOG goes down the drain, it hardens and causes sewer pipes to clog. This can lead to a sanitary sewer overflows (SSO) where raw sewage may back up into your home, lawn, neighborhood and streets. SSOs can cause health issues and sewer may even run into local water ways which can affect drinking water quality.

If your pipes become clogged, it can be very expensive problem to fix. NEVER put FOG down the
