- Time blocks are first-come, first-serve. Once we meet our facility capacity, wait times may become extensive. Be sure to arrive before your desired time block. One time block per person, per day in order to allow maximum exposure opportunity to all in the community.
- Admission is \$1 per child under 18 and \$2 per adult 18 & older. We accept cash.
- Be sure to stay hydrated and bring something to drink!
- In order to keep our little ant friends away, please remember we do not allow outside food on our pool deck. However, you can enjoy your meal/snacks on the picnic tables by the pool entrance or at our playground outside of the pool perimeter.
- Check those pool bags and make sure you do not have any glass! This includes bottles, food jars, etc.
- All attendees under the age of 12 must be accompanied by someone 18 and older at all times.
- If we are at capacity and someone leaves, we cannot hold your spot.
- Fred M. Evans Pool is an alcohol, drug and smoke-free facility. This includes vapes and tobacco use of any form.
- Have fun in the sun! But be sure to wear your sunscreen, of course!

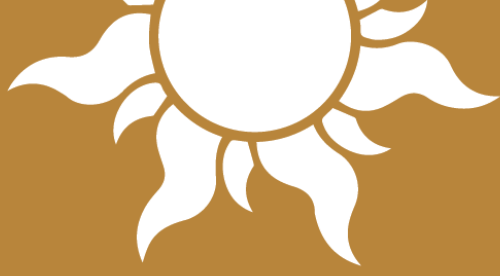

Downtown Wine Crawl

"Wine About Winter...in flip-flops and tank tops" is returning this spring to Downtown Salisbury on Friday, June 3. Wine connoisseurs throughout the region are invited to tour the wines of Rowan County, North Carolina and beyond during the ninth annual wine-tasting crawl.

Participants will sample wines at participating local shops and restaurants throughout downtown from Main to Kerr Streets. Attendees will receive a tasting map with access to 20 wine samples, a signature Wine About Winter tasting glass, and a

special Wine About Winter bag. Free trolley shuttle services will be provided for quick travel to all locations.

Tickets are \$24.50 plus taxes and fees per person in advance and \$32 on event day, if not sold out.

All ticket holders must be 21 years old or above. A state-issued photo I.D. showing date of birth will be required for each ticket holder in order to pick up their tickets (regardless of age).

Ticket holders will check in at the Visitors Center (Paul E. Fisher Building) located at 204 E. Innes St. Doors will open at 4 p.m. For more information or to purchase tickets, visit downtownsalisburync.com.
