### Craft Beer Bubbles Over At Park!

Join us in Downtown Salisbury for the second annual Bell Tower BREWFEST, to celebrate the art of craft beer, and showcase our buzzing downtown on Saturday, Oct. 7 from noon to 7 p.m.

This ticketed event will allow attendees 21 or older to experience the diverse flavors offered by craft breweries from all over North Carolina. The weekend kicks off with Salisbury's Best Busker contest, Buskers' Bash, which celebrates the best local talent from musicians to dancers to magicians on Friday, Oct. 6 from 5 p.m. to 9 p.m. (entertainment from 5:30 to 8 pm).

The festivities continue with the BREWFEST on Saturday at Bell Tower Green. Attendees will have the opportunity to enjoy a variety of local and regional breweries, live music, food trucks, and more.

Tickets are \$38 per person in advance and \$42 the day of. \*additional processing fees and tax not included. Tickets include one (1) souvenir BREWFEST cup, tasting map, wristband, and free tastings (4oz pours) from over each of the participating 20 breweries.

AGE RESTRICTION: All ticket holders must be 21 years old or above. State-issued photo I.D. showing date of birth is required for each ticket holder in order to pick up your tickets (regardless of age). Each individual ticket holder must be present when checking in or purchasing tickets.

Tickets will be available online the day of the event or purchased the day of at Bell Tower Green (120 S. Church St.) from either of the tent locations.

# **Deputy City Manager**

Current Carrboro Town Manager Richard J. White III will be Salisbury's deputy city manager. His first day with Salisbury is Monday, Nov. 6.

White has more than 25 years of varied local government experience, including jobs as assistant city manager in Asheville, N.C., and town manager in Elon, N.C. He also held positions with the city of Charlotte and the Unified Government of Athens-Clarke County in Athens, Ga.

Some of White's key successes throughout his career are leading Elon's volunteer-led fire service transition to a town-managed service with an improved ISO rating, initiating and obtaining Elon's North Carolina Main Street designation, managing Athens-Clarke County's \$14 million American Recovery and Reinvestment Act Program funds, and leading the Asheville City Staff COVID-19 Response Team.

White is the first person to hold the Salisbury deputy city manager role, a position with increased responsibility and leadership. As Salisbury's first deputy city manager, White will work closely with Mayor and City Council, residents and city departments on community priorities.

White was a Morehead-Cain Scholar and NC Fellow at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and holds a master's degree in public administration from North Carolina State University, where he was a Housing and Urban Development Fellow.





## Loose Leaf Collection Coming Soon

Loose leaf collection will begin on Monday, Oct. 16th and will end on Monday, March 11. During this time, please place your raked leaves at the curb by Monday morning of your collection week to ensure they are collected by that Friday. For proper pickup, make sure there are no large sticks, limbs, or trash debris in your leaf piles. Have the leaf piles no more than five feet deep from the curb and at least three feet away from any obstructions such as mailboxes, cars, and utility poles.





