One of the prettiest feathers in Salisbury's cap, the Sculpture Show, curated by the Salisbury Public Arts Commission, has returned with 21 new sculptures by artists from across the Eastern United States.

As a new initiative for 2022, the Public Arts Commission made a call for neighborhoods to apply as hosts for sculptures. Featured neighborhoods this year are: Castlewood, Country Club Hills, and Milford Knoll Neighborhood.

The 2022 Sculpture Show runs from May 2022 through April 2023, and features works by Matt Amante, Carl Billingsley, Jim Collins, Richard Conn, Robert Coon, Jim Gallucci, Hanna Jubran, Dean Leary, Roger Martin, Jason Morris, Jordan Parah, Charles Pilkey, Richard Pitts, Silo AR+D, and Wayne Vaughn. Residents and visitors can begin their self-guided tour by picking up a brochure at the Visitor's Center, 204 E. Innes Street. Inside the brochure, participants will find a map, information about each sculpture, and instructions to download the free Otocast app, which provides an audio tour and interactive map. Tips To Prepare For Hurricane Season

The Atlantic hurricane season runs from June 1 through November 30. To keep your family safe this hurricane season, and to minimize risks associated with severe weather, follow these tips from Salisbury's public safety officials:

- Develop an emergency communications
- Check flood insurance and know your insurance policy.
- Suild your emergency kit (and don't forget) to prepare an emergency kit for your pet).
- f If you live in an area that is likely to flood, designate a location on higher ground that you can move to before floodwaters reach you.
- Learn how to use a generator safely.
- Never touch a downed power line, stay away from it, and report it to the power
- Never walk, swim or drive through floodwater. Remember: Turn around, don't drown.

City Council Approves 2022-23 Budget

Salisbury City Council voted on Tuesday, June 21 to approve the fiscal year July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023 (FY23) budget.

The \$50,631,540 balanced General Fund budget reflects a 6.6% increase in spending from the FY22 adopted budget. In addition to the general fund, the water/sewer, transit, broadband and stormwater funds comprise the overall city budget totaling \$93,381,414. This

total also includes capital reserve funds. Based on feedback from Council during the Tuesday, June 7, budget preparation meeting, the approved FY23 city budget maintains the current tax rate of \$0.7196.
